
In the 2013 “Global 500 Climate Change Report” published by CDP (formerly Carbon Disclosure Project) in September 2013, Komatsu is confirmed as a leader and one of the most advanced companies worldwide in efforts to reduce emissions of greenhouse gas in

the manufacturing and supply chain processes.

CDP is an independent NPO founded in London, UK, in the year 2000. It’s the world’s largest program used to evaluate the engagement of private-sector companies in preventing potentially dangerous global climate changes.

The project is highly trusted by world-wide investors: it is today supported by 722 institutional investors that represent USD87 trillion in assets.

Every year, CDP sends a standardized “climate change” survey to the world’s large listed companies. Replies are analysed to evaluate





corporate performance and efforts of the world's 500 largest companies to tackle global climate changes.

In the 2013 CDP report, Komatsu was awarded 95 points out of 100 in the Climate Disclosure Leadership Index and an "A" in the Climate Performance Leadership Index. We were the only Japanese company with such a high ranking in the "Industrials" sector.

Komatsu recognizes the effort to protect the environment as one of our highest priorities: it fulfils corporate social responsibilities and ensures sustainable growth.

Based on this commitment, Komatsu aggressively makes efforts to reduce our environmental impact, including the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, in all aspects of our corporate activities.
